## Towards the 3rd World March for Peace and Nonviolence

On June 21, 2022, the 3rd World March for Peace and Nonviolence is announced in the frame of the Nuclear Ban Week in Vienna. It comes after two multitudinous worldwide marches that toured the planet in 2009 and 2019 showing the world that one of the major aspirations of people everywhere is Peace, and that Nonviolence is increasingly integrated into their collective imagination and behaviour. In this webinar we will show how they started, how they are organized and how the third one is taking shape and aspires to be a step further in the building of the path that human beings started long ago towards Peace and Nonviolence.

### GUESTS AND SPEAKERS



Liz Vásquez, from Peru, is a campaigner for nuclear disarmament and an activist in grassroots organizations such as Fridays for Future, both in Peru and in Mexico, where she lives.

Angel Chiessa, from Honduras, is a medicine student in San Pedro Sula (Honduras) who works for peace and nonviolence and has organized the activities of the previous World and Central American Marches being responsible for the largest Human Peace Symbol in Honduras.

Rafael de la Rubia, from Spain, is the founder of World without Wars and Violence, the organization behind the Marches, and is the father of the idea, the promoter and the coordinator of the World Marches. He has been an activist for more than 50 years now.

They are members of the World Coordination Team of World without Wars and Violence. We will count on the interventions of more activists from the International and Local Base Teams who have participated in the marches.
